- There are many observances that take place in April. Superintendent Kane shared several:
 - April is Autism Acceptance Month, Child Abuse Prevention Month, and National Occupational Therapy Month.
 - O This week is National Assistant Principals Week
 - Paraprofessional Appreciation Day is April 3rd.
 - O National Library Week is April 7-13th.
 - National Librarian Day is April 16th.
 - O Public School Volunteer Week is April 19-23rd.
 - O After School Professionals Week is April 22-26th.
 - School Bus Driver Appreciation Day is April 23rd.
 - \circ Administrative Professionals Day is April 24th.
- The Foundation for Douglas County Schools' Apple Awards Gala, held on March 30th, was incredible. Congratulations to the 2024 Apple Award winners!
- The DCSD Art Exhibition starts this month at Legacy Campus:
 - \circ The middle and high school exhibition runs April 19-24th.
 - The elementary exhibition runs April 27-May 2nd.
- Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) testing is underway at many DCSD schools while others will begin soon.
 - For the first time in a decade, DCSD is the top scoring district in the Denver Metro area.
 - DCSD is very close to being "Accredited with Distinction" and hopes to achieve this distinction next year.
 - OMAS testing is important for our students and teachers because they help us understand where our students are academically, how our schools are performing, and where we can focus our efforts to improve.
- The next Parent University webinar is scheduled for April 3rd at 5:30 p.m. The topic is the Role of Child Find Assessments for our Preschool-Aged Students. Christina Howery, School Psychologist, and Mary Beth Karr, Occupational Therapist, will lead this webinar.
- Daniels Fund released the names of their 2024 scholarship winners. Six of the scholarship recipients are from DCSD high schools.
- The Douglas County Special Education Advisory Committee (DCSEAC) thanks the community for supporting its annual Shining Star awards. On March 27th and 28th, DCSEAC delivered Shining Star baskets to the winners.
- Franktown Elementary and Redstone Elementary received the 2024 Recognized ASCA Model Program (RAMP) designation by the National Association of School Counselors. These schools will be recognized at a future Board of Education meeting.
- The 2025-2026 and 2026-2027 Academic Calendar survey closed March 31st with over 11,000 participants. Information will be shared at a future Board meeting.
- Invitations have been sent out for the DCSD Retirement Ceremony which is taking place May 1st at DCSD Legacy Campus.

Superintendent Kane, Chief of Staff Colella and Information Technology Officer Blair presented an overview of generative artificial intelligence (AI) and its implications including opportunities for students, teachers and staff. DCSD is working to be at the forefront of AI adoption in school districts and is currently exploring a district partnership with Kahn Academy through a Khanmigo Pilot Program. A total of 28 schools volunteered to pilot this program during the 2024-2025 school year.
