Call to Order and Roll Call

1. <u>Call to Order</u> RECOMMENDATION: Presiding Board Member calls the meeting to order.

The meeting of the Board of Education of Douglas County School District (DCSD) Number RE-1, held at 620 Wilcox St., Castle Rock, CO, 80104, was called to order by President Peterson at 5:00 p.m.

4. Board Recognition of National Association of School Resource Officer (NASRO) <u>Practitioners</u> RECOMMENDATION: Information only.

The Board of Education recognized National Association of School Resource Officer (NASRO) Practitioners from the Douglas County Sheriff's Office, Castle Rock Police Department, and Parker Police Department.

The NASRO Practitioner program was established as a way for NASRO, police agencies, and school districts to recognize officers who have excelled in school-based policing. To obtain the status of NASRO Practitioner, officers must meet certain requirements:

• School Resource Officer for a minimum of three years.

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- Employed as a school resource officer or in the field of school safety.
- Complete a NASRO-approved 40-hour Basic School Resource Officer training course.
- Complete a NASRO-approved 24-hour Advanced SRO or Supervisors and Management training course.
- Complete an additional 160 hours of specialized police in-service training related to school safety.
- Attend at least one NASRO School Safety Conference.
- Complete and submit the formal application along with supporting documentation of all training attended.

Superintendent Reports

5. <u>Superintendent Updates</u> RECOMMENDATION: Information only.

Superintendent Kane provided the following updates:

- September is Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month. DCSD teaches Signs of Suicide in 7th, 9th and 11th grades. This is a suicide prevention program that teaches students how to identify the warning signs of depression and suicide and how to have conversations about it.
- Yesterday was September 11th (Patriot Day). Superintendent Kane asked everyone to take a moment of silence to acknowledge the many heroes who lost their lives that day and the first responders who ran into the rubble.
- The Continental League Super Summit took place on August 26th at Chaparral High School.
- DCSD has been offering employee wellness events in cooperation with our health care partners. Flu shot clinics are currently being held at worksites across our district.
- Superintendent Kane gave a shoutout to the high schools and students who will be celebrating Homecoming in the coming weeks.
- The Foundation for Douglas County Schools' Building the Dream Gala will take place on September 29th at Legacy Campus.
- Youth Congress will be held on October 23rd at the State Capitol.
- Superintendent Kane discussed school funding at the September 11th Student Advisory Group (SAG) meeting.
- Employees who were hired by June 30th and stayed with DCSD through August 31st will receive their one-time retention stipends in the September 20th payroll.
- The Partnership for Douglas County Government's CEO Event was held September 7th at Cherokee Ranch.
- This year, DCSD's Nutrition Services has served 200% more student lunches and 400% more student breakfasts. Additionally, Nutrition Services has served 26,000 employee lunches since the beginning of the school year. Free lunch for employees was implemented this year as a retention strategy.
- PSAT testing will occur the first week of October.
- DCSD's first Professional Development Day of the school year will be held on September 22nd.
- Hispanic Heritage Month begins September 15th. Conexión, in partnership with DCSD, will host a Hispanic Heritage Month celebration on September 19th at Legacy Campus from 6:00-7:30 p.m.

President Peterson advised:

- The next Regular Board Meeting is scheduled for September 26, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.
- Agenda Planning for the September 26th Board Meeting is scheduled for September 14, 2023 at 10:30 a.m.
- President Peterson may be out of town on September 26, 2023. If so, he will try to attend remotely and Vice President Williams will chair the Board meeting.
- DCSD staff are continuously working with our law enforcement partners to improve school security, response and unified command.
 - Lock down drill protocol has been expanded to include student questions and answers with staff and law enforcement personnel.
 - $\circ~$ Best practices for student searches has been implemented across DCSD.
- He and Director Ray attended the Douglas County Special Education Advisory Council (DCSEAC) meeting on September 6, 2023.
- He discussed the cruciality of attracting and retaining Educational Assistants (EAs). DCSD is currently down 155 EAs.
- He and Director Meek gave a presentation on school funding to the Lone Tree City Council on September 5, 2023.
- He thanked DCSD staff for showing up on their personal time to have their cars painted to get the word out about the criticality of passing DCSD's mill levy override and bond initiatives.
- He stated that the Board has no plans to require universal masking or COVID vaccination as a condition of in-person education or employment barring a legal statewide mandate.

Vice President Williams thanked school resource officers and DCSD staff for their dedication to school safety and to growing our students academically and as human beings.

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14. Director Items, Board Committee and Liaison Reports RECOMMENDATION: Information only.

Director Page stated that he attended the Bridge Car and Bike Show on August 26, 2023 and attended his first District Accountability Committee (DAC) meeting on August 31, 2023. The DAC will present its Unified Improvement Plan recommendations to the Board for consideration on September 26, 2023.

Director Winegar advised that she attended Invest in DCSD's car painting session last Saturday and thanked those staff and community members who came out and got their cars painted.

Director Myers advised that Douglas County Youth Initiative's Youth Congress will be held on October 3, 2023 at the State Capitol, that Douglas County Community Foundation's Heroes Gala will be held on September 21, 2023, and that she and Director Ray attended the SAG meeting on September 11, 2023. Also, on September 5, 2023, Director Myers accompanied a DCSD school bus driver on his morning route and then toured DCSD's transportation terminals and Operations and Maintenance sites.

Director Ray echoed President Peterson's comments on the essential work performed by EAs and the cruciality of attracting and retaining them, gave a shout out to the DCSEAC and relayed their desire to be represented on the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC), and expressed SAG members' desire to promote DCSD's mill levy override and bond initiatives.

Director Meek provided updates from the last LRPC and DAC meetings, announced that the Foundation for Douglas County Schools' Building the Dream gala would be held on September 29, 2023 at Legacy Campus, stated that President Peterson did a great job presenting the mill levy override and bond initiatives to the Lone Tree City Council, and stated that she would be canvassing this weekend. She also recommended that Board subcommittees be given the capability to stream their meetings via Zoom to engage additional stakeholders and be more transparent.
