A. Provide a brief overview of the CTE Pathway

The pathway to business education begins at the high school level, specifically at TRHS. The progression of courses is as follows:

- 1. Level 1: Business and Marketing Essentials
- 2. **Level 2**: Intro to Sales / Principles of Marketing (MAR1011, MAR2016) College Credit Eligible (CE)
- 3. Level 3: Intro to Advertising / Social Media for Business (MAR2020, MAR1055) College Credit Eligible (CE)
- 4. Level 4: IB Business SL/HL

Students can enter the program at various levels, and upper-level courses offer opportunities to earn college credits through ACC or IB testing.

At the middle school level, the Intro to Business and Entrepreneurship course provides students with a foundational overview, preparing them for future options at TRHS. This course also promotes vertical Professional Learning Community support, co-advisory boards, and integration with FBLA.

To establish FBLA at RVMS in connection with this course, the following Career and Technical Education (CTE) requirements must be met:

- A credentialed instructor (K. Kruse has the necessary credentials)
- A minimum of two approved business courses (each lasting one semester)
- An active FBLA chapter (or another Career and Technical Student Organization) with a program of work and calendar of events
- An advisory committee with a designated chair
- Compliance with ADA, equity, diversity, and inclusion standards

While no documentation is required, integrating work-based learning concepts from the continuum (available at https://cwdc.colorado.gov/strategies/work-based-learning) into the courses is encouraged.

B. How does this CTE Pathway fit into the overall educational program?

This CTE Pathway is available in all DCSD high schools. ThunderRidge, our feeder high school, features a robust Business and Marketing Pathway that includes a yearlong course, Business and Marketing Essentials (BAM), which students can transition into directly from Ranch View. ThunderRidge also offers several Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs) that complement this pathway, including DECA (for marketing students) and FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America).

At the middle school level, the Intro to Business and Entrepreneurship course, offered for one semester, allows students to explore fundamental business concepts. This prepares them for the pathway and related extracurricular opportunities in high school and beyond.

C. What benefits would our student receive from this CTE pathway?

Students would benefit from a direct connection to programming that supports their future at ThunderRidge and aids in their career exploration. They will also have the chance to join FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America) at the middle school level, allowing them to apply their learning through real-world experiences and competitions. Currently, this opportunity is not available within DCSD. FBLA is approved at the state level, and DCSD high schools have historically excelled in FBLA programming. However, FBLA can only be offered at the middle school level if there is an approved business course in place. The Intro to Business and Entrepreneurship course meets this requirement.
