OVERVIEW OF STATE ACCOUNTABILITY

Education Accountability Act of 2009 (SB 09-163) authorizes the Colorado Department of Education to:

- review of the performance of public schools and districts annually.
- make recommendations to the State Board of Education concerning the type of school improvement plan and the accreditation category for each district.



PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

- The performance frameworks (SPF) measure attainment on the key performance indicators identified in SB 09-163 as the measures of educational success:
 - -Academic achievement
 - -Academic longitudinal growth
 - -Postsecondary and workforce readiness (HS only)
- State identified measures and metrics for each of these performance indicators are combined to arrive at an overall evaluation of a school's or a district's performance.




ASSESSMENT DATA USED IN SPF

- Academic Achievement
 - -English language arts, math and science CMAS assessments
 - –PSAT Evidence Based Reading and Writing and Math (<u>HS only</u>)
- Academic Growth
 - -English language arts and math on CMAS assessments (3-8)
 - -PSAT and SAT growth (HS only)
- Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness (<u>HS only</u>)
 - -SAT
 - -Dropout, Graduation and Matriculation Rates

Low Participation


below 95% participation rate in 2 or more content areas

ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

For Priority Improvement Schools (Year 0)*:

- General UIP requirements, plus additional planning requirements specific to accountability clock (e.g., parent engagement strategies, Turnaround strategy,)
- Parent notification and public hearing
- Adoption of UIP by local board
- Oct 17 UIP submission for CDE review (newly identified districts and schools may request an extension to Jan 16).

BOARD OF EDUCATION ACTIONS

Action Options:

- Adopt the plan as written
- Adopt the plan with pending revisions
- Delay adopting plan until January 10, 2023 to allow HOPE to make revisions

Note - The plan must be adopted by the local school board by January 16, which is the state's due date for UIP submission for Priority Improvement and Turnaround plans.
