5. Engagement Letter to Retain Outside Legal Counsel

Attachment #1: Engagement Letter to Retain Outside Legal Counsel

The Douglas County School District Board of Education frequently retains outside counsel to advise it on certain matters regarding legal and parliamentary considerations. Will Trachman is the former General Counsel to the Douglas County School District, having represented both the School District and the Board of Education in 2016-2017. His previous contracts were approved by a 7-0 vote in November 2016 and by a 7-0 vote in July 2017. During his tenure as General Counsel, Mr. Trachman kept open lines of communication between himself and all Directors, and apprised all Directors regarding legal work being done on behalf of the School Board and its Directors.

Mr. Trachman left the School District to serve honorably with the United States Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights from 2017 to 2021, working first as Deputy Assistant Secretary, and later as Senior Counsel. He has extensive experience advising and counseling stakeholders with respect to parliamentary procedure, civil rights law, and litigation risks. Mr. Trachman's services will be provided and billed on an hourly basis as requested by Board Directors.

The Board of Education is authorized by law to acquire, on such terms as it sees fit and necessary, real property to be used for School District purposes. The Regents of the University of Colorado Denver own real property located in Douglas County and have entered into a Purchase and Sale Agreement with the District. The School District's staff has engaged in a diligent review of the property and have determined that the property can be beneficially used for School District purposes. On November 17, 2021 the Board authorized the Superintendent to be able to proceed with the purchase by providing a "Notice to Proceed" by the required deadline of 12:00 p.m. MST on December 8, 2021. A Special Meeting of the Board on November 30, 2021 was conducted to allow for additional questions and concerns submitted by public stakeholders to be addressed by District leadership and outside experts.

This action item will allow each Director to indicate their preference to the Superintendent on issuing (or not issuing) the "Notice to Proceed" and continue to execute the purchase of the CU South property. The decision to purchase the ACC Parker property is on a separate timeline and will take place at a future date.

Therefore, management of common communicable diseases will be guided by the Douglas County School District Board of Education, and directed by the Superintendent in consultation with the Douglas County Health Department, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and other agencies as appropriate and their references to available disease data, with an emphasis on Douglas County-specific data. The District shall comply with the requirements of federal, state and local law and applicable public health orders.'

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Friendly Amendment by Director Ray to clarify that the Board is to adopt the revisions to Policy JLCC Communicable Diseases and Long-Term Illnesses as amended, and not the policy.
