RENEWAL RECOMMENDATION:

It is the recommendation of DCSD staff that the charter contract between Douglas County School District (DCSD) and Challenge to Excellence be renewed for a term of 5 years.

RENEWAL APPLICATION PROCESS & EVALUATION:

The renewal process provides an opportunity for schools to (1) present any new or supplemental evidence of school performance and (2) articulate school plans and capacities for the next charter term. The charter renewal recommendation to the Board will be based on an array of evidence gathered over the charter term, including data and information collected by Douglas County School District Office of Choice Programming, the Colorado Department of Education, and any supplemental information that the applicant group provides.

The renewal process begins in September when the charter school declares its intent to apply for renewal. No later than September 1, the charter school submits its Renewal Application to the DCSD Office of Choice Programming. All information is presented to the Superintendent's Cabinet through a compilation of evidence collected through the school's site visit, an analysis of the school's educational, operational, and financial health, and any feedback provided to the DCSD Office of Choice Programming by the applicant team upon initial review of this final report.

SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Mission: C2E prepares students for a complex social, global and economic future by delivering a comprehensive educational program with a challenging curriculum that combines the basic skills with a strong focus on standards-based education. Our curriculum will integrate reading, writing, math, and science through the applied technologies to result in students who are critical thinkers, problem solvers, life-long learners, and achievers, flexible and adaptable, empowered, and academically well-rounded and proficient.

Key Design Elements:

- Technology immersion is a schoolwide focus, where students use computer devices in all grades for all subjects to enhance learning.
- C2E focuses on achievement through engagement, using curriculum with interactive and creative instruction.
- STEM lab is being built, and partnerships are planned between local businesses such as Lockheed Martin and United Launch Alliance to turn student projects into real-world work.
- Social Emotional Learning is implemented through Sources of Strength in grades 3-8. K-2 students use Olweus Bullying Prevention Program until Sources of Strength develops their primary curriculum.
