What I've wanted to do and my interest in serving on the LRPC is to incorporate an I Matter in schools and to create a community in-person center rather than an online one. With this, capital would be something on the floor to discuss, showing my use for wanting to join the Long-Range Planning Committee.

From the student perspective, there's so much to discuss and actually share about future plans for the BOE regarding facility usage and attendance. With this idea in mind, it'd help combat the school attendance barrier and the facility usage in schools to increase and grow in diversity. On top of that, what I've also been doing is collecting surveys on how we can better improve mental health services within the county to see not only how we can improve it from a youth perspective but as a whole community. I really believe that with the efforts of the LRPC and from a youth perspective while also understanding the adult perspective professionally, the committee, in my opinion, is a very professional stance on our county, and believe that this can be a really good fit for me. As part of the Youth Commission, one of the many issues we face is seeing if the land permits us to actually do the event and understanding what land zones/permits are and why there's a curfew, understanding these few key items would make me an ideal candidate for the LRPC.
